## **iPhone Owners will be able to Disable Power Management Feature**

Apple recently explained that slower performance of older iPhones is intentional, implemented as a "power management" plan through an iOS update. While it was ostensibly intended to prevent phones from crashing in situations when their worn-out battery couldn't supply enough juice to support demanding functions, owners are upset they weren't notified it was happening. Apple CEO Tim Cook stated that not only will owners be able to check the health of their battery, but they can also turn off the performance-slowing power management, with a warning that it could lead to unexpected restarts. Our first peek at the feature will come in a developer preview later this month.
