Windows 10 Update Broke Google Chrome?

Microsoft's latest round of patches for the OS resolves an issue that was stopping Chrome from working on some Windows 10 devices. The fix should resolve issues with all versions of Chrome following build 67.0.3396.79, which was released in early June. It is not the first time that Windows 10 has clashed with the popular Google browser. After Microsoft introduced a bundle of new features to Windows 10 with the April 2018 Update, a number of users complained about frozen screens and other issues. These latest patches for Windows 10, bundled under the update KB4284848, are for machines that have applied the April 2018 Update and are running build 1803. The Edge browser will also no longer seize up when downloading certain fonts and overall performance is improved on laptops with hybrid graphics adapters, such as the Surface Book 2.
